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What modes will be studied?

Arterial Bus Rapid Transit (BRT)



Modern Streetcar





What modes will be studied?

	Streetcar	Enhanced Bus
Runningway	Typically operates in mixed-traffic lanes, but can also be in right-of-way exclusively for streetcar vehicles	Enhanced bus vehicles operate in mixed traffic
Station Spacing	Station located every 1/4 to 1/4 mile	Stations can be located every 1/4 to 1/2 mile
Station Amenities	Stations can range from basic stops with minimal passenger amenities to LRT-like stations	Stations can range from basic stops with minimal passenger amenities to LRT like stations
Vehicle Type	Electrically powered vehicles with overhead wires. Some vehicles are testing on-board batteries for short distances	Diesel or diesel-electric hybrid vehicles. Some vehicles testing battery electric-only operation.
Passenger Capacity	Between 115 and 160 passengers per vehicle. Unlike LRT, vehicles operate as single units.	Between 60 and 105 passengers per vehicle.
Cost per Mile	\$30-60 million per mile	\$2-6 million per mile
Example Operating Locations	Portland, Seattle, Toronto	Kansas City, Oakland, Seattle







Arterial BRT

- Courage Kenny to downtown/U of M West Bank

Streetcar to Nicollet Mall

- North Memorial
- West Broadway to Penn
- Courage Kenny via Golden Valley Road
- Courage Kenny via McNair



What are the screening criteria?

Criteria	Requirements
1. Economic Development Opportunities	• Has potential to improve employee access to jobs within and outside the corridor and has potential for transit-oriented development
2. Connections to the Regional Transit Network	 Is compatible with existing and planned transportation modes and infrastructure Provides connections to the regional transit network
3. Potential Right-of-Way Impacts	Requires minimal right-of-way
4. Capital Cost	• Costs below \$250 Million in order to qualify for Small Starts funding
5. North Minneapolis Coverage	• Serves West Broadway between the Mississippi River and 26 th Avenue– the heart of the commercial corridor in North Minneapolis
6. Expandability	• Has potential for expanding in the future if warranted
