Paying for your B Line ride

There are no fareboxes on B Line buses and drivers are not responsible for checking fares. Pay your fare at the station **BEFORE** you board. This allows customers to board faster, keeping service more reliable.

Fares for the B Line

These fares are valid all day, every day.

Ticket machines at stations accept cash and credit cards; exact fare only, no change given.

There is a reader at each station to validate Go-To Cards and passes. Or download the Metro Transit app to buy tickets right from your smartphone. Like other METRO lines, you pay for your ride at the station, not on the bus. Metro Transit Police or TRIP Agents board buses to check proof of payment. Be prepared to show your B Line ticket, validated Go-To Card, pass, transfer, or Metro Transit app ticket. Those without proof of payment are subject to a fine. Connecting to other service is easy

B Line tickets are valid for unlimited rides on local buses and light rail for 2½ hours after purchase. There is a surcharge if you transfer to an express bus.

B LINE TO LOCAL BUS: Show the driver your B Line ticket or app ticket or touch your Go-To Card/pass to the reader on the connecting bus. **Do not insert your ticket in the farebox.**

B LINE TO TRAIN: Touch your Go-To Card/ pass to the reader on the rail platform before you board.

BUS/TRAIN TO B LINE: Touch your Go-To Card/pass to the reader at the B Line station before you board.

Always have your validated card/pass, valid ticket, or transfer as proof of payment ready in case it is requested by Transit Police or TRIP Agents.

The new B Line is bus rapid transit. It's part of the expanded METRO network of fast, frequent, all-day service that connects you quickly to destinations all over the metro. The METRO network includes light rail (Blue and Green lines) and bus rapid transit (Gold, Orange, Red, A, C, and D lines).

This 13-mile line will connect neighborhoods and destinations in Minneapolis and St. Paul along Lake Street and Marshall and Selby avenues. It's another way Metro Transit is connecting people, strengthening communities, and improving lives.

The B Line will replace Route 21 and provide faster and more reliable transit service in the Lake/Marshall/Selby corridor. Bus rapid transit brings better amenities, faster service, and a more comfortable ride.

Longer buses with three doors

Customers pay their fares at the station, so they can board at any door and keep buses moving.

You'll find all the great features of regular Metro Transit buses – bike racks, low floors for easy boarding, and ramps to assist those with mobility needs. B Line buses feature two ways for customers with mobility devices to position and secure themselves while riding. Plus, there's free Wi-Fi and USB/C chargers so you can power your phone or tablet onboard. **Get details at metrotransit.org/B-Line-project.**

So frequent you won't need a schedule

The B Line will operate every 10-15 minutes from morning to evening every day of the week, with less frequent service in the early morning and late at night. Service starts at around 5 a.m. and ends around midnight on most days. Each station has NexTrip signs with real-time information, so you'll always know when the next B Line bus will arrive.

Enhanced stations for a better experience

B Line stations feature shelters with heating and light, NexTrip signs with real-time information, and security features that include cameras and emergency telephones. Stations are equipped with bike racks, benches, and trash and recycling containers.
