



Pay no fare on routes 32 & 62!

Service on Route 32 and Route 62 will be free through Dec. 31, 2024.

- Fareboxes will be covered
- Board through the front or back doors on these routes
- If you transfer to another route, you will need to purchase a fare

The Free Fare Pilot is required by the state’s transportation bill.

How were these routes chosen?

Routes 32 and 62 serve people in the east and west metros. They also serve corridors where many residents identify as Black, Indigenous and People of Color, are low-income, or who do not have access to a vehicle.



Metro Mobility riders can ride system-wide for free!

All Metro Mobility-certified riders can ride any regular-route service without a fare during the pilot. This includes buses, METRO lines, and Northstar Commuter Rail. Just show your Metro Mobility card or a government-issued ID with an ‘A’ endorsement when you board and your ride is free!

Certified riders can also ride free on Plymouth Metrolink, Maple Grove Transit, Minnesota Valley Transit Authority, and SoutWest Metro.

Note: The free fare pilot for Metro Mobility riders does not apply to any on-demand service including, Transit Link, Metro Transit micro, Maple Grove My Ride, MVTA Connect, Plymouth Click-and-Ride, or SW Prime.
