### **Quality Bicycle Products**



Employers interested in ways to reduce employee health care costs can look locally at how Quality Bicycle Products' (QBP) employee health and wellness program, which includes incentives for bike commuters, is paying off. The company, headquartered in Bloomington, is a wholesale distributor of bicycle products. Its motto, "Every Butt on a Bike," provides a window on QBP's corporate culture.

QBP worked with its health insurance provider HealthPartners on a study of about 100 employees who participated in the company's Bike to Work program. The findings? From 2009-2001, QBP's health care expenses dropped 4.4 percent, while the national average increased 24.6 percent.

In addition to lower health care costs, the study reported that QBP's commuter benefits program also contributed to productivity gains of \$900,000 over the years studied.

"We've learned that the expenses of setting up a program are more than paid back by a high return on investment," said QBP Commuter Advocacy Coordinator Alice Erickson.

Among the employee benefits, QBP provides indoor and outdoor parking for bikes; lockers, showers and a towel service; commuter credits (available for employees who use smart commute options) for purchasing bike parts, accessories and apparel; a bike shop and monthly bike maintenance classes; and other incentives.

QBP is advocating locally and nationally for more investment in bicycle infrastructure and invites employers interested in setting up their own commuter benefits programs to contact them. Learn more here.

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
