On Saturday, Dec. 6, several transit service changes are scheduled to take place within the Route 6 corridor.

Route 6 will be replaced by the new METRO E Line and new Route 36 will serve the south end of former Route 6.

## Fast. Frequent. All Day. All Yours. The new METRO E Line.

The E Line will travel between Westgate Station near Prospect Park and Southdale Transit Center running mainly on Dinkytown's 4th Ave., on Hennepin Ave. through downtown Minneapolis, and on France Ave.

#### **New Route 36**

The new Route 36 will operate every 30 minutes on Xerxes Ave. between 78th & Johnson and Uptown Transit Station.

#### Route 540

Route 540 is a suburban local route that runs from Mall of America to Normandale Lake offices, traveling primarily along 76th St. every 30 minutes on weekdays, and every 30 - 60 minutes on weekends. Route 540 offers service along portions of Minnesota Dr., 77th St., 74th St., and Cahill Rd., replacing Route 6K service. Service along 78th St. will be discontinued.









#### Know the difference between Route 36 and the E Line

Route 6 service will end Friday, Dec. 5, 2025. The E Line will replace Route 6; new Route 36 will replace part of Route 6 starting Saturday, Dec. 6. Here's how transit service will be different from Route 6.

#### **METRO E Line**



The E Line will be faster and serve fewer, improved stops between Westgate Station near Prospect Park and Southdale Transit Center.

### Route 36



Route 36 serves many stops between 78th & Johnson and Uptown Transit Station.

#### Frequent service every day

- Daily service every 10 12 min. between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m.
- Early morning/late evening: every 15-30 minutes



Service operates every 30 minutes.



Pay your fare at the station before boarding. **It's only \$2.** 



#### **HOW TO PAY:**

**Buy a ticket:** Ticket machines are located at each station platform.

#### To buy a ticket:

- 1. Push the Start button
- 2. Select Buy a ticket/Use voucher
- 3. Select your fare type
- 4. Select Quantity
- 5. Add to cart
- 6. Select + ADD MORE to add more tickets
- 7. Select Check Out or Add another ticket
- 8. Select Pay with cash, credit card, or coupon
- 9. Make Payment
  - Cash Exact change only
  - Credit Card Fully insert card, hold, remove when prompted
  - Coupon Good for one ticket purchase only

**Go-To Card:** Touch your Go-To Card to the card reader before boarding the bus.

**App:** Use the Metro Transit app to pay for your fare. Download the app at metrotransit.org/app.

You pay when you get on the bus, just like Route 6. **It's only \$2.** 



#### **HOW TO PAY:**

**Go-To Card:** Touch your Go-To Card to the card reader as your board.

**App:** Use the Metro Transit app to pay for your fare. Download the app at metrotransit.org/app.

**Cash:** Insert your money in the farebox next to the driver. Fareboxes accept dollar bills, coins or tokens, but change is not available.

#### Station features:

Shelters with heat and light, NexTrip real-time signs, benches, ticket machines, Go-To Card readers, security cameras, emergency phones, and trash bins.
