Thanks for helping us promote Rideshare to Work Month in October.

During the month, Metro Transit and the region's Transportation Management Organizations offered incentives to encourage more commuters to share the ride in a carpool or vanpool.

To be eligible for prizes, commuters had to set up an account with our Rideshare Planner. Active users were eligible if their profiles were public and if they performed a ridematching search in October. We recorded 2,110 new or active users during the month, which was 62 percent higher than October last year.

Fare policy change takes effect Jan. 1

Please be aware that bus drivers will no longer issue Rail-Only Transfers effective Jan. 1.

Customers who transfer between a bus and light rail should use a Go-To Card for an easier way to pay their fare. Go-To Cards automatically include a transfer when a fare is paid.
