WHAT WE DO

We are committed to the personal safety, quality of life, and protection of property for everyone in our transit community. Our agency oversees one of the country's largest transit systems. Officers respond to and investigate all crimes reported on buses, light rail, commuter trains, facilities, and right-of-ways.

We are fully-sworn peace officers with the same powers of arrest as other city or county law enforcement agencies. Our officers can take enforcement action off Metro Transit property for traffic violations, petty offenses, or any other criminal act. We will take the necessary steps to control a scene, then defer the case to the local agency.



Our department is one of the most diverse in the state, with 37% of staff identifying as a person of color.

We signed the **30x30** Initiative pledge in 2023 – a mission for 30% of our force to be female by the year 2030.

OUR METHODS

We believe in proactive policing and community engagement. We use analyzed data and trends to deploy personnel to critical locations throughout the system. We will never criminalize homelessness or individuals suffering from chemical dependency. Our **Homeless Action Team** connects people with food, clothing, medical, and social services. This nationally renowned program has helped 500+ adults and children find more permanent housing since its launch in 2018.



SPECIALIZED UNITS

We have **10** specialized units, which include K-9, Crisis Intervention Team, Crash Scene Reconstruction Unit, and SWAT/Counter Threat Unit.

SECURITY CAMERAS

We have **3,125** live security cameras across the system – which provide real-time video of buses, light rail trains, platforms, and transit centers.

RESOURCES

Our fleet consists of **73** marked and unmarked squads.
