Training

Your career as a Metro Transit Police Officer begins with a 20-week field training program. Probationary officers receive initial classroom training then are assigned to a Field Training Officer (FTO) and spend four months being evaluated by different FTOs.

Upon successfully completing Field Training, probationary officers are assigned to a patrol area. Newly hired officers are listed as probationary officers for the first year of service. Following the first year of service; officers may then bid patrol assignments based on seniority.
