

Metro Transit is hiring Inventory Control Specialists (Stockkeepers)

Metro Transit stockkeepers are our inventory control specialists. They are responsible for the receiving, warehousing, and issuing of all parts, supplies, and commodities used by Metro Transit to maintain its fleet of revenue vehicles.

Stockkeepers support all 13 warehouse and maintenance facilities. Stockkeepers work 5 days per week and cover 3 shifts during each of those 5 days. They control over 15,000 stock keeping units (SKUs) with more than 75,000 combined SKU/warehouse locations. The current standing inventory these stockkeepers control is over \$50 million. Last year stockkeepers performed over 580,000 inventory transactions whose dollar value was over \$600 million.

Metro Transit is one of the country's largest transit systems, employing more than 3,200 people, and provided nearly 78 million rides in 2019 through an integrated network of buses, light rail, and commuter trains. In 2016, Metro Transit was named System of the Year by American Public Transportation Association.

ABOUT STOCKKEEPER BENEFITS

State Pension — As a stockkeeper, you are enrolled in the Minnesota State Retirement System General Employee Plan. <u>How the plan works is detailed here.</u>

Paid Time Off — As a stockkeeper, you earn: 1. Vacation:

- \cdot one week vacation on January 1 of your first year
- \cdot two weeks vacation on January 1 of your second year
- \cdot three weeks vacation on January 1 of your sixth year
- \cdot four weeks vacation Janaury 1 of your 11th year
- \cdot five weeks vacation Janaury 1 of your 18th year
- · six weeks vacation January 1 of your 25th year
- 2. Sick time: You accrue 80 hours a year up to a total of 2800 hours of sick time
- 3. Seven paid fixed holidays (New Years, Martin L. King Day, Memorial Day, Juneteenth, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas)
- 4. Four floating holidays
- 5. Recognition time: eligible to earn 16 hours a year and accrue up to 40 total hours

Health Insurance — As a stockkeeper, you can choose between three health insurance plans. Premiums are computed each new year before open enrollment.

- Open Access (high premium, low copay and no innetwork deductible)
- Distinctions (lower premium, low copay and slightly higher deductible)
- Health Reimbursement Account (lowest premium/ employer contribution offsets deductible)
